



Navy 2020 pay tables

As compared to other professions in the civilian world, the Indian Navy has a great deal to offer to young men and women. The three general military categories of rank are Enlisted, Warrant Officer, and Commissioned Officer. Each rank comes with a distinct set of responsibilities that enable service members to fully contribute their talents to the military. Understanding these designations will help you to map out your military career. Special Warfare Combatant-Craft Crewman, or SWCCs, are elite members of the U.S. Navy, providing support to the Navy SEALs. They insert and extract special operations units and work in coastal areas to gather shipping information and intelligence about enemy military installations. SWCCs earn pay at their enlisted pay grade as well as additional allowances and special pay for their specialized duties. The SWCCs are paid based on their rank and time in service according to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service. Enlisted ranks begin at the E-1 pay grade and go up to the E-9 pay grade. When a sailor first enlists at the E-1 pay grade, he earns \$1,531.50 per month in basic pay, as of 2014. At the highest enlisted pay grade, E-9, sailors must have at least 10 years of service and will earn between \$4,836.90 and \$7,509.60 per month in basic pay. In addition to basic pay, SWCCs earn additional Navy allowances for housing and subsistence. As of 2014, the Basic Allowance for Subsistence is \$357.55 per month. The Basic Allowance for Housing amount is determined by rank and number of dependents. At the E-1 level, a SWCC with no dependents and \$1,243.20 per month with dependents. In addition, SWCCs with dependents earn \$250 per month during deployments as a Family Separation Allowance. SWCCs also earn up to \$600 per month in special duty assignment pay, according to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service. This is a discretionary pay and the Navy determines the specific amount SWCCs receive. In addition, qualified SWCCs earn \$165 per month in parachute pay. This amount increases to \$225 per month for High Altitude Low Opening jumps. The Navy offers an enlistment bonus of \$8,000 for SWCCs, as of 2014. Reenlistment bonuses may also be available. In addition, SWCCs receive special tax considerations as military members. For example, while basic pay is taxable, allowances, including basic allowance for housing and subsistence, are tax-exempt. the Dec. 12 announcement of a 3.1% pay increase by the Department of Defense. New pay rates will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2020 and will be reflected on the paychecks that are issued on Jan. 15, 2020.
